site, Galapagos National Park is a paradise of protected islands bursting




with unique marine life found nowhere else on earth. Diving adventures here encompass everything from aggregating hammerheads and whale sharks, to penguins, marine iguanas, and more. The sheer number of rare species is nothing short of



incredible. Plus, at the isolated Wolf and Darwin Islands, you can watch as huge schools of scalloped hammerheads, silky sharks, and tuna float on by. With so much to see, All itineraries include tours ashore to see endemic giant tortoises, blue-footed boobies, and more. If you like natural spaces, sharks, and spectacular diving, then liveaboard scuba diving in the Galapagos Islands is a must!

Wolf Island is a small, uninhabited island located about 150 miles from the central Galapagos 1. It is accessible only by liveaboard boats. The island is home to countless birds and sea lions 1. Wolf Island is known for its world-class diving experiences 2. The most popular dive site at Wolf Island is El Derrumbe, which is on the southern east side of the island. Divers can watch schooling hammerheads, Galapagos sharks, and the occasional whale shark swim past 3. Due to currents and occasional surges, diving at Wolf Island isn't recommended for beginners

The dream dive of all the scuba divers in the world who come diving in Galápagos, Darwin Island. Named after the famous Charles Darwin. On this island, you have two main dive sites. One is called Darwin's Towers (previously Darwin's Arch) and the other is Darwin's Main Island dive site. Darwin and Wolf's islands are the most remote islands of the Galápagos archipelago. They are located 160 km (100 miles) northwest of Isabela



island, and they are most famous for diving expeditions. The most famous characteristic of these islands is the huge amount of hammerhead sharks you can find underwater due to the remote location and currents passing through these islands the hammerheads just delight



hammerheads, you will also see many rays, eagles, and manta rays, and there's a great chance of seeing whale sharks too. .I hope this information helps. Let me know if you have any other questions
